



HEALTH CARE NEEDS POLICY

PURPOSE

To ensure that Orchard Grove Primary School provides appropriate support to students with health care needs.

To explain to Orchard Grove Primary School parents/carers, staff and students the processes and procedures in place to support students with health care needs at school.

SCOPE

This policy applies to:

- all students who have been diagnosed with a health care need that may require support, monitoring or medication at school.
- all staff, including casual relief staff and volunteers.

This policy should be read with Orchard Grove Primary School's First Aid, Medication, Anaphylaxis and Asthma policies.

STUDENT HEALTH SUPPORT PLANNING

In order to provide appropriate support to students at Orchard Grove Primary School who may need medical care or assistance, a [Student Health Support Plan](#), or other specific health management plan (such as an Individual Anaphylaxis Management Plan), will be prepared by the First Aid Officer in consultation with the students' parents/carers and treating medical practitioners(if applicable).

At enrolment or when a health care need is identified, parents/carers should provide accurate information about the student's condition or health care needs, ideally documented by the student's treating medical/health care practitioner on a Medical Advice Form (or relevant equivalent)

Students with complex medical care needs, for example, tracheostomy care, seizure management or tube feeding, must have a Student Health Support Plan which provides for appropriate staff to undertake specific training to meet the student's particular needs.

Orchard Grove Primary School may invite parents/carers to attend a Student Support Group meeting to discuss the contents of a student's Health Support Plan and assistance that the student may need at school or during school activities.

Where necessary, Orchard Grove Primary School may also request consent from parents/carers to consult with a student's medical practitioners, to assist in preparing the plan and ensure that appropriate school staff understand the student's needs.

Student Health Support plans help our school to assist students with:

- routine health care support needs, such as supervision or provision of medication
- personal care support needs, such as assistance with personal hygiene, continence care, eating and drinking, transfers and positioning, and use of health-related equipment
- emergency care needs, such as predictable emergency first aid associated with asthma, seizure or diabetes management.

Student Health Support Plans will be reviewed:

- when updated information is received from the student's medical practitioner
- when the school, parents/carers have concerns with the support being provided to the student
- if there are changes to the support being provided to the student, or
- on an annual basis.

MANAGEMENT OF CONFIDENTIAL MEDICAL INFORMATION

Confidential medical information provided to Orchard Grove Primary School to support a student will be:

- recorded on the student's file
- shared with all relevant staff so that they are able to properly support students diagnosed with medical conditions and respond appropriately if necessary.

COMMUNICATION PLAN

This policy will be available on Orchard Grove Primary School's website so that parents/carers and other members of the school community can easily access information about Orchard Grove Primary School's health care needs support and procedures.
